


The Deluge of the November 13th Weekend:












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And now the good news — The Salmon are back!

photographer, Bill Beatty, on November 17th show just how resilient the Coho salmon are.

Bill's comments: "I don't believe it! As of 3 p.m. today, I counted at least a dozen spawners in Stoney just from the trail. The water has subsided quickly in the creek and they seem to have just come out of nowhere, in spite of the godawful mess on the flats! (Matsqui Prairie). What incredible fish!"





Postscript: during the last week of the month, another 230 mm of rain fell, bringing the total to over 540 mm. It was a historic event.
